JUDGMENT FOR PETITIONER

The above-entitled cause came on regularly for hearing on April 15, 2009, at 9:30 p.m. in Department 301, Hon. Peter J. Busch, presiding, pursuant to the verified petition petitioners, with counsel present as indicated on the record.

The cause was heard and both oral and documentary evidence was received.

27 28 The cause having been argued and submitted for decision, the Court being fully advised, the Court having directed that judgment and a peremptory writ of mandate should issue in the cause;

It is ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED

- 1. Judgment is entered in favor of petitioners.
- 2. That a peremptory writ of mandate issue commanding Respondents/Defendants Governor Schwarzenegger and Director Gilb to set aside the portions of the Governor's Executive Order S-16-08 calling for a furlough and salary reduction for State Fund employees represented by the California Attorneys, Administrative Law Judges and Hearing Officers in State Employment ("CASE");
- 3. That a peremptory writ of mandate issue commanding Respondent/Defendant Controller Chiang to immediately pay petitioners their full salary without any reductions pursuant to the illegal furlough directed by the unlawful Executive Order;
- 4. Those portions of the Governor's Executive Order S-16-08, insofar as they will and have resulted in furloughs and salary reductions for State Fund employees represented in this action, does not apply to petitioners;
- 5. That a preliminary and permanent injunction is hereby issued directing the Governor, DPA, Jan Frank as President of State Fund, and the Controller to cease and desist taking any action to furlough petitioners by reducing their hours and reducing their pay under the aforementioned unlawful executive order.
